## Writing Prompt and Directions:

In Historical Fiction, research into historical figures, locations, events, and culture is necessary in order to best enhance the fictional narrative. While our protagonist, Jefferson Davis Bussey, is fictional, the majority of characters he meets in the Union and Confederate armies were historical figures as well. The purpose of this reports will be to research these figures in order to understand both their historical significance and how their use helped enhance the plot of the novel.

## In this report, you will:

- 1. Select a historical figure present in Rifles for Watie
- 2. Give biographical information on their life before the Civil War
- 3. Discuss their historical activities during the American Civil War, and their relative importance to the overall war effort of their respective side (Union or Confederate)
- 4. Compare the historical data you've researched about this individual to how they are portrayed in the novel
- 5. Discuss whether or not you find the novel's portrayal of the individual an accurate one.

Your report should be approximately 3-5 pages in length, and must contain a bibliography referencing both the novel and all other sources you use to provide historical research on your selected character. Your essay should by in 12-point, Times New Roman font, and double-spaced. Your essay must be printed out and submitted to your homeroom teacher on the first day of the 2024-25 school year.
