
Incoming 5th Grade Summer Reading Assignment

- 1. Read the book *Number the Stars* by author Lois Lowry. You can either buy the book or go to your local library and borrow it.
- 2. Follow the detailed directions on the Number the Stars Newspaper Book Report sheet.
- 3. Assembly of newspaper:
 - a. Create the newspaper on a 22×28 poster board/oaktag board.
 - b. Make sure your name and grade is on the bottom right hand side of your newspaper.
- 4. Last, you will need to <u>create a presentation of your newspaper</u> where you describe the different sections of your newspaper.
 - a. The presentation should last about 2 minutes.
 - b. Begin with the title/name of your newspaper.
 - Then share something important, useful, funny, or meaningful about each section of the newspaper.
 - d. Write your presentation on 4×6 inch index cards.
 - e. Number each index card so that your presentation is not mixed up.

Newspaper Requirements:

Title/Name of Newspaper: The title must be related to Number the Stars, but you may NOT use the exact book title as the name of the newspaper.

Book Summary: Write a 2-paragraph summary of the book's plot with a catchy headline. Be sure to include the title of the book somewhere in the summary or the headline.

Character Profile: Select a character from the book and write a 2-paragraph article that describes them in detail! Include what he/she did and any interesting facts. Create a catchy headline and draw a picture that accompanies the article.


Advice Column: Have a main character write a letter to a newspaper advice columnist seeking help with a major problem from the book. Create a fake name for the character/person to use in the letter. Then, write a response from the columnist that reflects how the problem is solved.

Fillers: Choose at least 2 of these options to include in your newspaper.

Advertisement: Based on something that was included in the story.

- Wanted Poster: Includes drawing & reward for the capture of a dangerous character.
- Crossword Puzzle: Use words and/or events that are part of the book.
- Sports: May use if there were any sporting events that were part of the book.
- Travel News: Based on the setting or a location that was mentioned
- Classified Ad: 'Help-wanted' or an ad for something to buy or sell.
- Lost and Found: Based on something that was lost as part of the book.
- Weather: Describe the weather for a period of time that is important in the book.
